Our National Cup Competitions

Your school will be taking part in this year's National Cup competitions, which consist of a number of knock out rounds leading, ultimately, to our National Finals, which usually take place between the months of March and May. These competitions are very much at the heart of what the ESFA has to offer and create thousands of opportunities for children to play grassroots football at a National level.

The different levels of competition we provide means that we offer chances for pupils with a range of abilities to represent their school on the football pitch – but we don't feel that the National Cup experience should stop here. We know that football translates across a broad range of subjects within schools and we hope that you can encourage pupils within the school to support your young footballers on their National Cup journey.

It makes such an incredible difference to the event on the day – we've had supporters make and bring along scarves in their team colours, bring along school mascots and even bring the school band!
