Please find below some useful guidance from the Football Association about the steps to take in the event of thunderstorms when planning for, or playing schools football.

Thunderstorm Guidance for schools football

Safeguarding Ratios

The Safeguarding team have shared information on safeguarding ratios when training or at fixtures. You can find the ratio guidance on the FA's website <u>here</u>, but they are also summarised below:

For 0 to 2 years:	one FA DBS checked adult to every 3 children (1:3)
For 2 to 3 years:	one FA DBS checked adult to every 4 children (1:4)
For 4 to 8 years:	one FA DBS checked adult to every 6 children (1:6)
For 9 to 12 years:	one FA DBS checked adult to every 8 children (1:8)
For 13 to 18 years:	one FA DBS checked adult to every 10 children (1:10)



Membership Perception Survey: Update

ESFA Council Members are conducting further conversations with Membership in their areas in order to understand how Members would like us to address the matters you raised in the perception survey earlier this year. Council will receive a further update on your views at its meeting in April.

Guidance for use of shinpads in Grassroots Football

The FA have shared the following messaging for us to share to our wider audience of membership:

"Safety is a key consideration for our game and the Laws of the Game state that shinguards/pads are a compulsory piece of equipment.

Shin-pads play an important role in injury prevention as they are intended to protect the shin from injury. The amount of shin physically covered is an important consideration as any part of the shin that is not covered is not as well protected. "Micro" or "Mini" shinpads may therefore increase the risk of injury due to the smaller amount of shin covered compared to larger sized shin-pads. We advise that when considering the protection offered by shin-pads, safety is prioritised by ensuring a good proportion of the shin area is covered and therefore protected. The materials used are also an important factor. Always look for a CE mark which means the shin-guards achieve minimum standards (BS EN 13061). We suggest that shin-pads not carrying such a mark should not be worn as they may present an increased risk of injury to players.

Please give these protection levels serious consideration when deciding what is the right shin-pad for you or for your child."
